2019 XTERRA PAN AMERICA TOUR RULES FOR ELITES

Step 1: Race and Score – Enter as many races as you want and score points by finishing in the top 15 of the elite field. There are five 100-point scale “Gold” races, and five 75-point scale “Silver” races. The season is from March to September.

Gold races: Brazil, Oak Mountain, Beaver Creek, Mexico, Utah

Silver races: Argentina, Chile, Victoria, Quebec, Dominican Republic

Step 2: We count 50% of the races, plus one. If 10 races on the Tour, best six scores count, regardless if gold or silver.

Note: The XTERRA Pan Am Championship race counts as one of those six scores regardless if you race or not.

Step 3: The male and female elite athlete with the most points at the end of the season earns the title of XTERRA Pan American Tour Champion. If there is a tie in points, the tie-breaker will be the person with the most wins. If still tied after counting wins, the person finishing highest in the most recent race where both competed. If no head-to-head exists, tie-breaker goes to the person finishing highest in the most recent race.

2019 XTERRA Pan American Championship: It is not necessary for elites to qualify to race at the XTERRA Pan American Championship, which will double as the XTERRA USA Championship on September 7 in Ogden, Utah. This is a one-day award as opposed to the Tour title which counts an elites’ best six race scores (inclusive of the Pan Am Championship). In Utah, the top overall male/female elite finisher, regardless of nationality, will be honored as the XTERRA Pan American Champion. The top American male/female elite will be named the XTERRA USA Champion.

Silver races offer the equivalent of \$7,500 USD in elite prize money to the top five men and women. Gold events offer the equivalent of \$15,000 USD in elite prize money to the top seven men and women. The XTERRA Pan American Championship race in Utah will offer \$20,000 USD for the race and distribute an additional \$60,000 USD in prize money to the top 10 men and women in the final XTERRA Pan Am Tour Elite Rankings.
